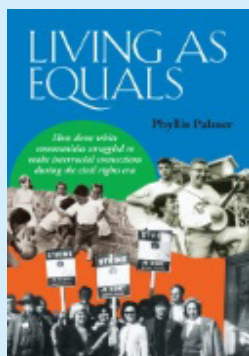

A Certified Fitness Trainer, Nutrition Coach and owner of Larry Berry Fitness, Mr. Berry addressed workplace safety issues, particularly workplace ergonomics. Mrs Berry, a yoga instructor, taught several basic exercises to help limit fatigue and injury.

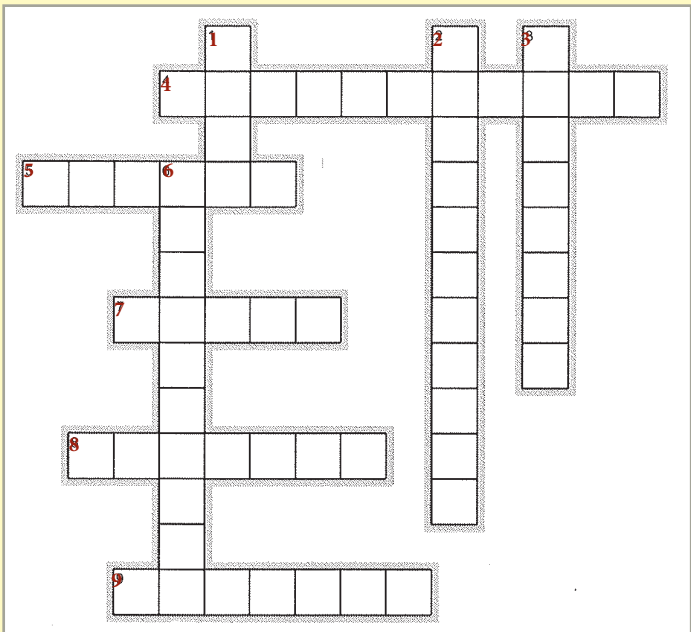

### Valentine's Day article in Credo Reference

#### ACROSS

- On Valentine's Day Christians often highlight scripture passages such as 1 \_\_\_\_\_ 12, known as the "love chapter" of the New Testament.
- Saint Valentine, for whom the day is named, was a Roman priest. Once imprisoned, he is credited with being the instrument through which God restored sight to the blind daughter of the \_\_\_\_\_, also known as a prison guard.
- Another patron saint also named Valentine shares this day, and he was the bishop of \_\_\_\_\_.

# Librarians Preparing Lee Yearbooks for Digitization Project

Squires Library personnel have completed the process of gathering Lee University yearbooks, academic catalogs, and other publications for a digitization project in which the resources will be made available online in full-text and with a searching function. Assistant Director Dr. Louis Morgan and Librarian for Distance Learning Lori Mattace initiated the project last summer and began collecting the yearbooks. Initially the digitization was proposed as an in-house project. However, during an Appalachian College Association meeting Library Director Barbara McCullough learned of a grant opportunity sponsored through the regional consortium LYRASIS in which they are digitizing some college and university collections, such as yearbooks. The librarians decided to go with the LYRASIS opportunity, which will save time, be less-expensive, and provide a professional result. Lori Mattace chairs the committee overseeing this project, which also consists of McCullough and Morgan. Student Assistant Lawrence Munoz has also assisted in some of the preparation of these Lee University resources for the digitization project.



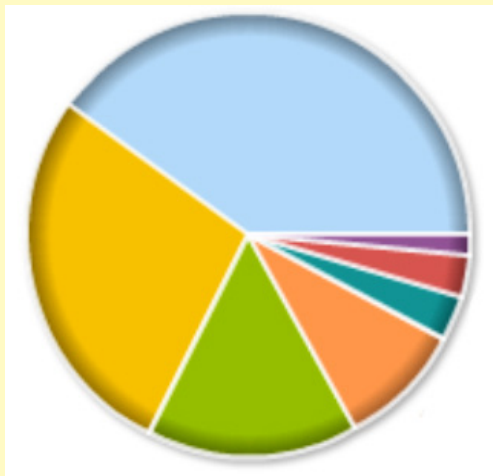
